A corrected demolition permit for 1 Chestnut Street has been submitted to the Dover Historical Commission and Charlotte will send a letter to the Building Department by the end of the week confirming our earlier vote that 1 Chestnut St. is not Historically Significant and should be demolished.

At this point there is no update on 6 Farm St.

Willow St. Bridge is need of a “ROW now owned by Leo Dunn III and Elizabeth J Alden. They are waiting to see if the owners will donate 120 square feet of their 9 acre lot or ask for compensation, or refuse entirely. (If that is the case them Eminent Domain would have to be exercised requiring town meeting approval.)”

Paul discussed World War II book by Kenneth W. Rendell. Ken Rendell has offered to show his house and museum to the Commission at a date convenient to all.

Paul reported that the Boy Scout who is doing is the brook signage project was away for the summer.

Dates for the rest of 2009 are October 6th, November 3rd, and December 1st.
