

Minutes of the Town of Dover, Board of Health meeting for March 22, 2010.

Present: Dr. Barbara Roth-Schechter, Chairperson; Dr. Joseph Musto, Member; Dr. Harvey George, Member; Mike Angieri, Agent for Septic Systems.

Meeting Called to Order at 7:00 PM

- 1) The minutes of the March 8, 2010 meeting were read and approved as presented.
- 2) 25 Meadowbrook. Deed restriction for no garbage grinder was approved.
- 3) 10 Powder House Road. Deed restriction approved for NO garage grinder and 4 bedrooms.
- 4) 14 Hartford Street. Deed restriction approved for 4 bedrooms.

- 5) 270 Dedham Street. Preliminary discussion for existing 6 bedroom house with a failed cess-pool was presented by Mike Cosmos of Edward Brooks Engineers. System will be up-graded with variances. Possible public hearing for April 12, 2010.

- 6) 71 Main Street. Public hearing for the up-grade of the septic system was presented by Cheney Engineering. Abutters from 73 Main Street had numerous questions about the up-grade and its potential impact on their ½ acre lot as it may also need a septic system up-grade. They will have to do some investigation of their lot and the abutting lots to fully answer all questions. Deed restriction for no garbage grinder was approved. Plan with variances was approved.

- 7) 5 Morningside Drive. The applicant requested an extension of time to address the review comments. The public hearing was extended until May 10, 2010.

- 8) Artificial Turf at Caryl Park recreational area. The Board discussed the proposed use of artificial turf at the play fields with Scott Seidman and Rich Oasis. Scott had replied to the Board's request for information about the turf material and the general issues raised by the Board.

The Board still had questions about the information provided: information not from an independent source; temperature rise on the field; 8-10 years life cycle and what happens then; potential release of hydrocarbons as the material ages and groundwater quality; potential health effect on children using the field; what will be the impact in 10 years when the material has to be disposed and potential cost.

Mr. Seidman would get more information about disposal costs. Mr. Seidman and Mr. Oasis both felt the project was worthwhile and benefitted the town.

9) Animal Rabies Clinic will be held April 3, 2010 from 3-4 PM at the town garage. A \$10.00 donation is requested.

10) Lyme disease. Mass Wildlife deer officer will be available May 19 or May 26 at 7:00 PM to meet with stake holders about deer management on their properties. Meeting date and format to be finalized by the Lyme Disease Committee during its April 1 meeting.
