MINUTES OF AUGUST 14, 2012 MEETING were approved.

**NEW BUSINESS:-**

Signed three deeds – Patrick and Rita Krolak, 61 Glen St. Dover for the purchase of Lot 45, Block G, 4 graves, Geo. and Nancy Mumford, 10 Longwood Dr., #134, Westwood for Lot 43, Block G, 4 grave, and Paul and Barbara Lannigan, 129 Centre St. Dover for Lot 39, Block G, 4 graves.

Bids were received for removal of many trees from the cemetery and after review of the bids the pruning and removal of two trees would go to Tree Tech and the fertilizing of trees would go to Tree Specialists. Bill Herd wanted to go on record stating that he felt the trees will all be dead by next year and they should have been slated for removal this year, but Pope and Carol want to see if the fertilizer can save them for a few more years. A memo will go to Craig Hughes of the Highway Dept. stating that sanding of the cemetery must be done with no salt in the mixture – sand only as it is killing the trees along the roadways.

An application was received for a headstone on the Rossi lot and SO APPROVED. Received a letter regarding the purchase of a lot from a former resident and we so VOTED to approve the purchase upon receipt of the application as they had lived in Dover for 25 years and they still own their home in town.

Discussion was held again pertaining to the deer problem and it was recommended that we put deer repellent throughout the cemetery prior to the end of September. SO VOTED.

Report on the water fall donations, it was noted that Richard and Janet (Comiskey) Giannini family donated \$100 and that Bruce Sooy donated \$100 in the memory of Edith Sooy.
