

Minutes of the Town of Dover, Board of Health meeting for September 16, 2013

Present: Members - Dr. Barbara Roth-Schechter, Chairperson; Members Dr. Harvey George & Dr. Joe Musto; Agent - Mike Angieri, Septic Systems; Agent George Giunta, Wells.

- 1) Meeting Called to Order at 7:00 PM.
- 2) The Board approved the minutes of the August 19, 2013 Board of Health meeting.
- 3) 5 Picardy Lane. Continuation of public hearing. Bob Vey of Norfolk Engineering presented the plan. No abutters were present. This is an up-grade for an existing 4 bedroom house with a failed septic system. Site is restricted by wetlands, poor soils and a zone 1 well radius. Board reviewed and approved the plan and deed restriction for an Elgen system and pump chamber to treat wastewater.
- 4) 9 Buttercup Lane. Evan Wilmarth, of Dover Survey, presented the plan. This is an existing five bedroom house with a cesspool. The plan proposes to install a new septic tank, pump chamber and Elgen treatment system. The Board approved the plan and deed restriction.
- 5) 75 Walpole Street. Evan Wilmarth, of Dover Survey, presented the plan. This is an existing three bedroom house with a cesspool. The plan proposes to install a new septic tank and Elgen treatment system. The Board approved the plan and deed restriction.
- 6) 4 Meadowbrook Road. The plan was prepared by Paul Saulnier of Civilized Solutions. He could not be present so Mike Angieri discussed the plan with the Board. This is an existing four bedroom house with a failed septic system. The plan proposes to install a new septic tank, pump chamber and FAST system with drip irrigation for wastewater treatment. The Board approved the plan and deed restriction.
- 7) Dancer farm Subdivision. The developer, Matt Zucker and septic system Engineer, Ron Tiberi, presented the plans for the septic system for the 8 lot subdivision. Extensive site evaluations were done on the 12 acres site at 30 Hartford Street to determine ground water levels for use in the design of the septic systems. This work involved: digging over 50 test pits: perc testing at various depths; ground water monitoring wells and computer modeling of septic system operation, all reviewed and approved by Neil Price at Horsely and Whitten, which took over a year to complete. The Board reviewed the plans and approved the systems for the 8 lots.
- 8) SPAN. Representatives, Bev Madden and Coryn Hall, discussed the activities of SPAN and the progress of the program in assisting school children with social issues such as alcohol and drug use. They are seeing more interest and more male students participating and have very active parent participation. They are looking to present more of a positive attitude towards these issues and are planning a program of "Social Norming". They have contracted with Michael Hanes, a

specialist in this area, to come to Dover on November 4, 7:30 PM at Lindquest Common) and November 5 to present a program to the school children and give SPAN members training. They are seeking some additional funding through various groups and thanked the Board for their continuing help and financial aid, which they hope could be increased to support additional activities, including those of social norming.

9) Tobacco Regulations. The Board postponed this discussion until the October 21, 2013 Board of Health meeting since a complete report by Town Council will be available at that time.

10) The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 PM.
