

## Dover Historical Commission Meeting

**Call Meeting to Order**— The Meeting was called to order by Jane Moore, the chair on at 7:05 PM

**Acceptance of the Minutes**---The Minutes for the June 8, 2015 Meeting were approved after a few changes.

### Old Business:

**95 FARM Street**—Richard stated that some tree cutting and land clearing were still occurring. House still intact.

**50 PINE Street** –Update. House still intact

**Brook Sign Project-- Historical House Signs.** Decided that the Commission should do a mock sign similar to the Historical Plaques and present to the Planning Board and Selectmen. The Brooks that cross under the roads are the ones to be marked. We should begin with the following brooks; Spring Brook, Tubwreck Brook, Fisher Brook and the Charles River in 3 locations. .

### New Business:

**Demolition Request**—received a request for demolition on 210 Claybrook Road. The Demolition Request was in the name of Diane Darling, who is the Court Appointed Personal Representative of Teresa Edmunds, the deceased property owner.

After much decision, Charlotte asked if she should reclude herself from the voting being an adjacent neighbor. The Historical Commission decided and voted to allow Charlotte a vote on this decision. . 5 Ayes for Charlotte to vote and 0 Nays and Charlotte absenting.

The Historical Commission voted that the House at 210 Claybrook Road is of “Historical significance” after much discussion and research that had been done on the house. The vote- 6 Ayes for Historical Significance” and 0 Nays. The new potential buyer will have to apply for a new demolition request if they want to demolish the house. The Building Inspector will be informed.

**Other** --- Names for potential Board Members were discussed and they were going to be asked by Jane if they would like to be presented to the Selectmen Board to be appointed to the Historical Commission.

Paul suggested that Highland Cemetery should be listed on the National Historical Register. He said that he would speak with the Cemetery Commission.
